

REFLECTION ON THE READINGS

Jesus, now in Gentile territory, is faced with someone unable to hear or speak. Followers of Jesus must be able to hear, and therefore to speak his word. But this man is not a disciple. Perhaps the Gentile setting explains Jesus' unusual word (Ephphatha) and actions. Does he use word and action to show he is the originator of the cure? The crowd are impressed: "he has made the deaf hear and the dumb speak".

SACRAMENTAL PROGRAM 2025

I will soon be writing to the parents of P3 children in our two schools. It is at this stage that children receive the sacrament of First Reconciliation. Last year it was necessary to baptize a good number of P7 children immediately before their first confession. This is never good practice. To avoid this happening again, I ask that parents of children who are not baptized to respond quickly to the letter which they receive. Children not baptized before the end of the year cannot be included in the sacramental program.

For many years Bill Kerr has acted as the Safeguarding Coordinator. Recently, Bill has suffered from a health setback and has decided to step down from this role. We thank him for the work he has done in this very important area and we hope his heath soon improves.

Assisted Dying for Terminally ill Adults (Scot)

Now that the General Election and summer holidays are over MSPs at the Scottish Parliament will turn their attention to the Liam McArthur bill on Assisted Dying. This is the third time that this type of bill has been presented to the Scottish Parliament. It is important that we write to all our MSPs including both the Constituency MSP for East Kilbride, Collette Stevenson and the seven Regional MSPs. Your email to all of them only needs to be - "I live in the area that you represent at the Scottish Parliament and I wish you to vote against the proposed bill on Assisted Dying".
