

FOODBANK COLLECTION

Astonishing response for this month's collection - 12 bags and £3604. Both Foodbanks have restated this week that they could not function fully without the support of Our Lady of Lourdes parishioners. In 2025 alone you have given just over £30,000. This month Loaves & Fishes received all of the bags and £1800 with £1804 going to Community Foodbank. Also, this month a parishioner handed over £500 from the annual collection from a Celtic fans' group. In turn, £250 was given to each Foodbank. Many thanks again for this.
